Leads will report back in September about the formation and membership of sub-groups.</p> <p>The Traffic and Transport section was discussed, and members agreed that it also needs to cover cycling, pedestrian etc and so agreed to rename to Getting Places or Getting Around.</p> <p>Members were reminded that the Neighbourhood Plan was a planning document and we are working towards additional planning policies for the area to sit within the Local Plan. There could be an additional chapter on aspirations to include factors outside of the planning framework eg improvements to existing infrastructure.
